## LETTER FROM THE BOARD PRESIDENT

Dear Friends of 15-LOVE:

Our 23rd year of operation, during 2012, marked another year of favorable accomplishments for 15-LOVE. In many ways, this eventful year was the most successful in our history. Not only did our core programming produce positive results, but we also undertook the ambitious project of rehabilitating 10 tennis courts at the important Michigan Avenue Park site in Schenectady, with a very successful outcome (see photo enclosed).



Some of the important program metrics that occurred in 2012 were: another strong year of attendance (3,800 participants); the active involvement and promising development of a strong cadre of Excellence Program participants (42); a top quality team of instructors (19), most of whom are products of our program; a talented group of our own current college scholarship students (9); and successful financial performance (with another balanced operating budget and also positive growth in our endowment – see financial details enclosed).

We have been utilizing the Michigan Avenue site in Schenectady ever since the 15-LOVE program began in 1990. Unfortunately, the 10 courts there had progressively fallen into disrepair over the years. Our board of directors decided to undertake their total rehabilitation to include 6 new mini courts and 8 new regular courts. We successfully raised over \$300,000 with the help of many supporters (see listing enclosed). These new courts have provided an active site for not only 15-LOVE programming, but also as an excellent venue for Schenectady High School matches, USTA tournaments, USTA Team Tennis, and tennis rally events. Furthermore, the substantial upgrade to the courts has provided a significant improvement to the immediate Mt. Pleasant neighborhood in Schenectady.

We are extremely grateful for the ongoing support provided by all of you, our friends and supporters. Without your generous assistance, we would be unable to provide the meaningful programming that is making a positive difference in the lives of numerous children, and their families, throughout the Capital Region.

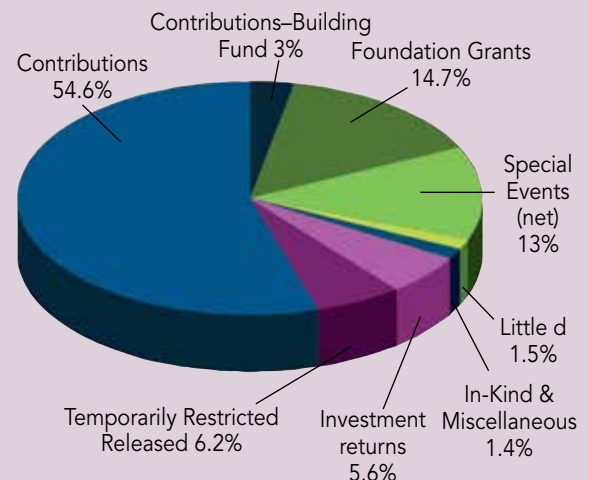

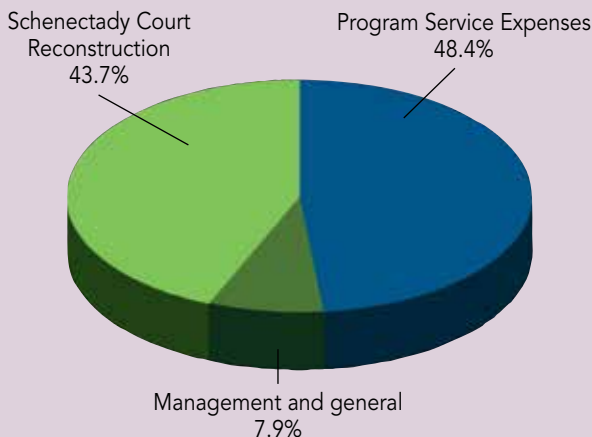

### HOW OUR FUNDS WERE SPENT

Just as we had hoped, our dreams in 2011 became realities in 2012! We dreamed of a garden at our office, and in May, that dream became a reality. We dreamed of holding a community event in our office to hand out free children's books, and in September, that dream became a reality. We dreamed of new, safe tennis courts in the Mt. Pleasant neighborhood of Schenectady at Michigan Avenue Park, and in November, that dream became a reality. In the midst of fulfilling our dreams, the reality of life went on, and in September, we lost a beloved Board Member, Ron Kohn. While I sit here in my recliner, trying to type this report and somehow make sense of how such dichotomies of our year might fit together, I am struck by one resounding similarity. In both the height of realizing our dreams and the gravity of the death of an active Board Member, we met amazing people who embraced our mission and made it their reality to find ways to help 15-LOVE. As I look back, I am humbled by the outpouring of support from both new and existing members of the 15-LOVE family. Please read on for more information about our dreams and realities:



#### Garden

In late April, John from Alternative Property Management showed up in our office and asked where we were with our garden dream. When we told him that we hadn't been able to raise enough money for that dream yet, he found a way to economically make it happen. In May, 10 raised beds appeared, followed by a shadow-box fence, and surrounded by crushed stone. Then, they fixed our landscaping and agreed to mow our lawn all summer at no cost. From there, Board Members and their friends donated gardening supplies, plants and seeds. A double hose appeared so that two kids could water at once. Knee pads showed up so that the crushed stone didn't hurt any (tennis) knees. And finally, kids showed up to plant the garden, and they came three times per week to water and weed and learn about gardening. After all the hard work, we threw a pizza party with sauce made from our fresh tomatoes, basil, parsley and oregano. Kids fought over green peppers and okra to take home to their families. It is nothing short of amazing.

#### Book Giveaway

In September, we held our first book giveaway event at our office. We had collected used children's books from a variety of places and built a closet to store them, but on this day they were proudly displayed on every table in our office. We sent flyers to the schools in the City of Albany, and were nervous that no one would show up. Before we technically opened the doors for the event, 23 people had come in. We saw over 200 people that day, and heard stories about how their teachers want them to read at home, but they have no books. We opened our garden up and had our excellence participants teaching people how to pick the vegetables and herbs, and we heard a grandmother say to her daughter and grandson that she had never cooked with anything fresh before as she was joyfully bagging up some basil. We have no idea how many books we handed out that day, but we never stopped refilling the tables. And we never stopped seeing smiling, excited faces on the kids walking out or smiling relief on their parents' faces. It was one of the best events we have ever held!

## Michigan Avenue

Michigan Avenue Park was a spot in the Mt. Pleasant neighborhood of Schenectady where we had held classes for over 20 years. We watched as the courts slowly became unsafe. We knew something had to be done, and when we embarked on this mission, we thought it might be a simple resurfacing job. It turned into a total reconstruction with a \$300,000 price tag. We worked hard to raise the necessary funds and get the plans perfected. The USTA's Technical Assistance Team guided us through the process and our contractors (Copeland Coating Co., AFSCO Fencing and HMA Contracting) were all amazing, and each one completed a small part of the project at their cost. When we opened the site in November with 8 full size courts and 6 smaller courts to accommodate younger children, it was the first site of its kind in Upstate NY. It has become a much sought-after place to play tennis and hold events. The neighborhood is supportive and proud of the new space, using it as a home base for neighborhood events and clean-up days. This type of project is not something 15-LOVE normally does, and I now know more than I need to know about tennis court construction and drainage, but we couldn't be more proud of this site and our gift to the City of Schenectady.

## Ron Kohn

Shock does not adequately describe our reaction to the news that Ron had passed away – we had chatted with him just the day before. Ron had been an invaluable board member, always with a smile and an interest in everyone's lives. Ron found time to make everyone in a room feel like they were the most important person there. What I was most struck by were the days and weeks after his death, fielding phone calls from his friends who called to both offer their support (some had held fundraisers in his memory to benefit 15-LOVE) and simultaneously try to find comfort. I brought a box of tissues into my office, because without warning in those days I would get a phone call, and the person's story and connection to Ron would send tears streaming down my cheeks. If there is at all a silver lining to be found in Ron's death, for me it is that I have had the opportunity to get to know his wife, Nancy, much better.

I generally write updates about our ongoing programs, and for 2012, I have chosen to write about some unique programs and events. Rest assured that in our ongoing program, we saw about 3,800 participants, we spent days in schools and afternoons in after school programs. We populated 13 parks over the summer with our 19 instructors and tennis equipment, drawing nearly 2,000 participants in those 7 weeks. Our volunteers read with second graders each week at Arbor Hill and Giffen Elementary Schools, and watched them blossom. Our Leadership participants traveled to Camp Fowler for the first time and loved their experience there. Our college prep graduates went on to Binghamton and Clarkson Universities. And life happened. We kept our high school kids off the streets with late night practices every Friday night (thanks to Tri-City Rentals / Fairwood Apartments) and USTA Team Tennis matches on Saturday nights. And we watched a new crop of excellence participants become instructors and find their voices. We helped feed our families by holding healthy cooking classes at our office, which are some of my favorite events since the whole family is involved and it is a chance for our kids to be together in a relaxed atmosphere and get to know each other a little better. All in all, 15-LOVE thrived while dreams and realities were taking shape in 2012. And none of this would have been possible without the help and support of each and every person listed in this annual report, and many others who we have met along the way. Thank you!

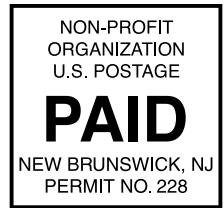
